GIVING IMPACT CONTINUED



Each holiday season, First Bank of Montana proudly hosts its annual 12 Days of Christmas Food Drive, inviting community members to join in supporting those in need. During two weeks in December, customers and residents were encouraged to donate the top 12 most-needed items identified by ten local food banks serving communities near our branch locations.

Donations were collected in bank lobbies, and FBMT pledged to match every non-monetary contribution—doubling the impact for local food banks. Thanks to the generosity of our communities and the bank's matching commitment, an estimated value of \$14,978 was donated. These contributions help ensure that families in need have access to essential nourishment during the holiday season and beyond.

"This initiative reflects the true spirit of giving and demonstrates what we can accomplish when we come together," said Dean Comes, Bank President. "We are grateful to our customers and communities for making a meaningful difference."

The 12 Days of Christmas Food Drive is one of many ways FBMT works to strengthen the communities we serve.



Each July, First Bank of Montana proudly hosts its annual School Supply Giveaway at all ten branch locations, helping ensure students have the tools they need for a successful school year. Employees collaborate with teachers in each community to identify essential school supplies for rural and underserved areas.

To meet these needs, FBMT partners with local businesses to purchase supplies within each community. Employees at every branch then pack drawstring backpacks and personally distribute them to students who arrive to pick them up—creating a moment of excitement and anticipation for the new school year. During the 2025 giveaway, 1,462 students in grades K through 6th received a backpack filled with necessary supplies. This initiative reflects the bank's commitment to supporting education and strengthening the communities we serve.

"This program is about more than school supplies—it's about giving every child the confidence to start the year prepared," said Dean Comes, President. "We are proud to partner with local businesses and educators to make this possible."


LEWISTOWN BRANCH




